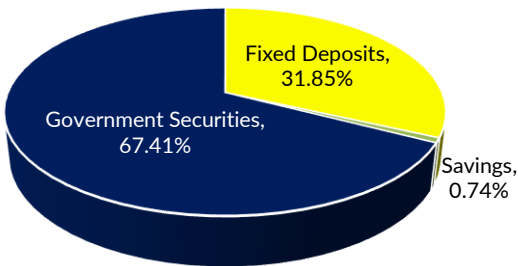

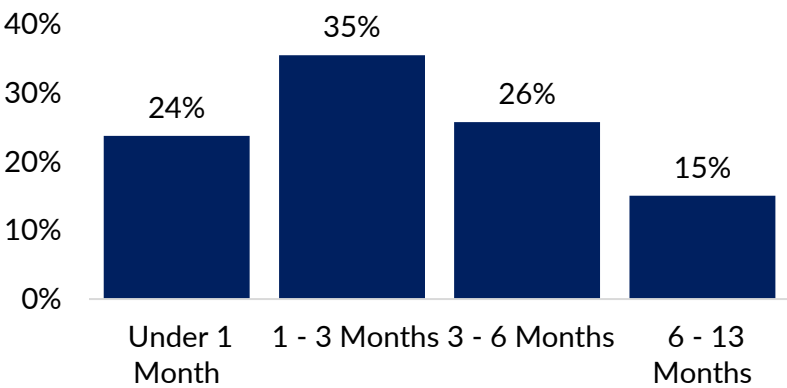

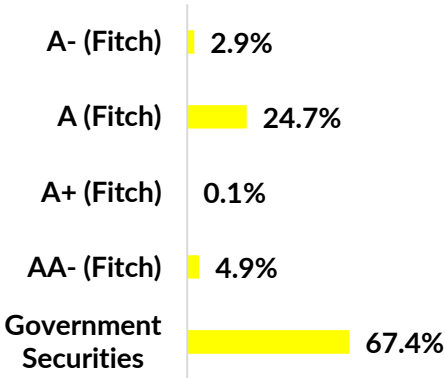
## Asset Allocation
